The Fool Says... Part Two

"The fool says in his heart, 'There is not God." Psalm 14:1, ESV

n last week's article we began to discuss arguments for God's existence. We focused on the incredible sophistication and complexity of DNA. This week we will look at the other side of the argument. Why do so many deny the existence of God even though there seems to be ample evidence of intelligent design? Different people will offer different answers and objections. Some are scientific others are philosophical. We will focus on one of the more common philosophical objections to God – suffering.

The argument is that if God truly exists and is all loving then there should be no suffering. Since there is suffering either God does not exist, or He is not loving. How can we answer this question? Why would a loving God allow suffering?

First, I would want to consider the fact that God created us as free moral agents. Throughout scripture we see this concept. Adam and Eve had a choice (Genesis 2-3). The people of Israel had a choice (Joshua 24:15). We all have a choice. Unfortunately, many people choose evil which often has a profoundly negative impact on those around them. God gives us the freedom of choice, but we must own up to the consequences of our choices.

Second, I would want to consider that at times, suffering serves as a reminder that this life is only part of our existence. Paul wrote in Romans 8:18, "For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us." Often, suffering forces us to reckon with the idea that one day we will all leave this earth. No one knows when that day will be which is why we must live in constant preparation. (James 4:13-17)

Third, I would want to consider that God is able to use even some of the most terrible situations for good. This does not mitigate or negate the reality of the pain experienced by the one suffering.
